Pamagirri Aboriginal Experience

- RAINFOREST AMPHITHEATRE** - This natural setting provides a beautiful backdrop for the traditional Pamagirri Dance Performance. The rainforest serves as the theatre walls whilst sounds of wildlife provide accompaniment to the haunting sounds of the didgeridoo and clapsticks. The amphitheatre is wheelchair accessible, and has a large protective canopy and tiers of comfortable wooden seats with the capacity for 400 people.
- DREAMTIME WALK** - This half-hour guided tour along an all weather walk-way modelled on the Rainbow Serpent, the mythical creator of the land, gives insight into aboriginal traditions and beliefs, and how several ancient implements were used.
- BOOMERANG THROWING** - After a demonstration and a few lessons from your Guide, you'll be ready to test your skills with this ancient Aboriginal implement. The area is specially netted for your safety, as boomerangs do come back!
- DIDGERIDOO PLAYING** - Your Guide will explain how the didgeridoo is made and used in ceremonies, then will demonstrate techniques used to play this ancient instrument - listen carefully for sounds imitating Kangaroos or the Kookaburra.
- SPEAR THROWING** - You'll be amazed at the distance your Guide can throw spears using a Woomera. One of our Guides, Jauwa, is listed in the Guinness Book of Records with a distance of 147.75 metres - that's one and a half football fields!

Restaurants

Koala and Wildlife Park

- KOALAS** - View Australia's sleepest marsupials sitting comfortably in their trees. You may even see a "joey" (a baby koala) stick its head out of its mother's pouch!
- WILDLIFE PHOTOS** - Have your photo taken holding a cuddly koala or a small crocodile (additional cost) - an experience you'll treasure for life!
- KANGAROOS & WALLABIES** - Get up close to free-roaming kangaroos and wallabies as they bounce around the park. You can even handfeed and pat them!
- CROCODILES** - Safely view freshwater crocodiles and their larger estuarine cousins, including "Jack The Ripper", one of the largest saltwater crocodiles in captivity - at over 5 metres in length, he weighs almost a tonne!
- CASSOWARY** - Meet Keita the cassowary, a large, flightless endangered bird native to Tropical North Queensland.
- DINGOES** - See these wild animals that are regarded as unchanged descendants of an early ancestor of modern dogs.
- BARRAMUNDI LAKE** - Look out for the region's most famous and tastiest fish. They can grow up to 2 metres in length and can weigh up to 60 kg!
- SNAKES** - Observe assorted Australian Python species in our snake house.
- LIZARDS** - See a collection of Australia's largest lizards and monitor lizards.
- TAWNY FROGMOUTH** - Keep your eyes peeled for our Tawny Frogmouths sitting camouflaged on the branches.
- KOOKABURRA** - Be sure to say 'G'day' to the iconic Australian laughing Kookaburra.
- LACE MONITORS** - Be amazed by the size of these massive reptiles as they sun themselves on their logs.
- TASMANIAN DEVILS** - The only wildlife park to house the endangered Tasmanian Devil species in North Queensland.

Tropical Fruit orchard

- Learn about the exotic tropical fruits of the region and the world, with over 60 species on display including jackfruit, paw paw, lychees, mango, cacao, carambola, star apple, and pineapple as well as regional produce such as tea, coffee, and sugar cane.
 - TROPICAL TREATS JUICE BAR** - Situated in the heart of the Tropical Fruit Orchard, you can sample refreshing delights grown on site, as well as ice-creams, juices and snacks.

Army Duck Rainforest Tour

Board here for your unforgettable 45 minute rainforest tour on an amphibious World War II Army Duck (officially spelt DUKW). Rainforestation has 12 of these historical vehicles, which hold up to 30 passengers and have 6 wheel drive, propeller and rudder. As you traverse the property, your guide will point out and explain ferns, orchids, strangler figs and stinging trees, as well as birds such as the Azure Kingfisher and a host of other animals and reptiles. As you splash into the lake, with propeller engaged, your Army Duck cruises up to the water's edge whilst turtles, fish and eels swim up close. Keep an eye out for water dragons or pythons sunbaking or slithering up trees.

Eco Initiatives
